There is no doubt that the man whose finger pressed the trigger was Lee H. Oswald. As to who may have commanded him to commit this crime there is considerable doubt.

There. B. I. has reported to the public that both Oswald and Rubenstein acted as individuals. That neither had any accomplices or was part of an organized plot either to kill the President or to silence his killer.

Frankly we doubt that this is true. While not presuming to second guess the nation's largest and best equipped investigative agency, their pat statement leaves too many questions unanswered--


## FOR EXAMPLE...

On the day that Oswald was captured it was widely announced on national radio and TV that he had also killed a Dallas Policeman and a Secret Service Agent.

During subsequent news coverage, there was no further mention of the Secret Service Agent. So far as we can tell, there was no official "correction" of these first reports. The subject was just quietly dropped.

To judge the possible reliability of these reports requires some knowledge of the steps taken by the Secret Service in guarding the President. As just one example, all the man-hole covers along the route he is expected to travel are scaled down well ahead of time. Each major building (or series of small buildings) is assigned to one agent whose responsibility it is to check the building and its occupants before the President passes and to guard it while he goes by.

It is true that the extensive travels of the large Kennedy family had placed a strain on the Secret Service. Even so it seems strange that so perfect an ambush site as the School Book Depository Building should be left unguarded. Our information is that the building was not left unguarded. That, in truth, the particular Secret Service man who had been assigned to that building was found dead, lying behind a stack of packing cases a few feet from the rifle used to kill the President.
