Re San Francisco airtel 12-20-63, Albuquerque airtel 12-24-63, and Dallas airtel 12-27-63.

Mr. JACK MOLLINS of 3675 Dorisa Avenue, Oakland, California, was recontacted on 1-6-64 and 1-15-64. Both times he advised that he had no additional information to furnish and that he did not desire to furnish the identity of the employee of the Post Office Department referred to for fear that this employee might lose her job. However, after re-evaluating his position on 1-15-64 he advised that the employee was actually his wife, Mrs. EDDIE VICTORIA MC FADDEN MOLLINS, who had been a temporary employee at the Post Office Curing the Christmas holidays.

Mrs. MOLLINS was interviewed and advised essentially the same information as previously reported. She stated that she was now seeking permanent status as a Post Office employee and had observed the two letters in question on Friday, <u>12-13-63</u>, and that these_two_letters were_both_addressed to an address in Napa, California, and bore the return address of Lee Oswald Marksmanship Fund, Albuquerque, New Mexico. No street address was listed, nor any other name on the return address. It appeared to her that both letters were written in the same hand and the handwriting appeared to be rather poor, as though written laboriously. She could furnish no additional information regarding these letters and no information concerning such organization has been furnished to the San Francisco Office.
