On 2/5/64, Mr. J. PAUL McCULLOUGH, Claims Examiner, III, Insurance Department, Texas Employment Commission, TEC Building, Austin, Texas, advised SA GEORGE W. H. CARLSON that sometime in November, 1963, he recalls receiving a letter from an individual who apparently was attempting to file a false claim. He stated that he has been unable to locate the letter, that he will continue to look for the letter; however, he doubts that he will ever find it, inasmuch as there are some 400,000 claims in the TEC office. He exhibited work papers reflecting his efforts to date to locate the letter which he recalled receiving.

Mr. McCULLOUGH stated that in substance the two-paragraph letter related that this individual who was making the claim indicated he probably would not receive due consideration just as "that person who appealed to Governor CONNALLY about resending a discharge from the Marine Corps and did not receive satisfaction."

Mr. McCULLOUGH said that the writer of the letter indicated he, the writer, might also have to take matters in his own hand. Mr. McCULLOUGH said the writer of the letter did not mention OSWALD by name and only described his appeal in a way that suggested to McCULLOUGH that the writer was referring to OSWALD.
