The following investigation was conducted by SA JAMES
A. MITCHELL:

AT SPRINGFIELD, MISSOURI:

On 1/31/64 MELVIN LEMONS, Secretary to the Warden,
Medical Center for Federal Prisoners, telephonically advised
WILSON received at the institution 1/17/64; however, it is
usually 90 days before any determination of mental competency
is made. His Classification Date is set for 3/25/64. He noted
that the Honorable Judge A. L. MEOVITZ, Northern District of
Illinois, Chicago, Illinois, requested that this examination
be done within 16 days or such reasonable time thereafter in
order to give the subject a thorough mental examination.

On 1/27/64 the Medical Center wrote to the Judge
and requested a 90-day extension informing him a report will
be sent to him as soon as examination completed.
