USA BAREFOOT SANDERS telephonically contacted the office at 2:35 this date and advised that HOWARD WILLENS, Executive Assistant, Criminal Division, and presently assigned the Warren Commission, JOE BALL and DAVE BELLIN, attorneys for the commission, are at his office. MR. SANDERS stated they expect another attorney to arrive later tonight, and at any one time for the next two or three weeks there will be as many as six lawyers from the commission in Dallas. These attorneys are in town to take testimony from witnesses.

MR. SANDERS predicated his conversation by saying "I would like to ask of you a favor." He said the commission representatives will be interviewing from 50 to 100 people within the next several weeks. They expect to interview tomorrow (3/20/64) the following:

MR. SANDERS stated they have the addresses and telephone numbers of these witness, however, they would like the FBI to locate these individuals for purposes of having them appear at their office for the necessary interviews.

MR. SANDERS was informed that the writer would have to make contact with SAC SHANKLIN and that he would receive a return call after the writer talked to MR. SHANKLIN. MR. SANDERS concluded
