SUBJECT: WALTER CASE, aka.
SM-C (RESERVE INDEX PROGRAM)

On 12/14/62, Mrs. EDDIE SUE FELCHER, 2112 Jackson Street, Dallas, Texas, Retail Merchants Credit Association, advised that WALTER CASE was formerly employed by the AFL-CIO, but as of 8/16/62, was employed as a dealer by the Fuller Brush Co., Hilline Drive, Dallas, Texas. The files reflected that WALTER CASE and his wife, ROSE, came to Dallas from Louisville, Ky., where they resided at 2345 Alexander Avenue. He was born 8/25/04 at Canadian, Texas and has previously been divorced. His parents are deceased and he has one child 10 years of age.

The Records Bureau at the Dallas Police Department and the Identification Bureau of the same department were checked by GEORGE KEMP and ROBERT H. SIMS, respectively on 12/13/62 and no record could be found on WALTER CASE.

On 12/14/62, Mrs. BEVELYN KEETON, Postal Inspector's Office, Terminal Annex Building, Dallas, Texas, advised that on 10/17/62, WALTER CASE had given a change of address to 10426 Desdemona, Dallas, Texas.

On 1/9/63, [redacted] advised that WALTER CASE had never been a member of the Communist Party in Dallas, nor was he known to associate with Communist Party members in this city.

In view of the above, it is suggested that CASE'S name be retained on the reserve index, inasmuch as he offers no potential for development as an informant, or any potential for development by the Soviets as a source, and it is suggested that this case be closed.
