states about 9pm he was sitting at his desk doing some paper work, and the W/ room in the lower floor, when he heard what sounded like a fire cracker explode above his head. He then looked and saw a hole in the wall to the left of where he was sitting. Officer Helms found the bullet in the next room lying on stack of packages of paper. The bullet entered the window on the west side of the room after passing thru the wooden frame of the window, and passed by compl's head and went completely thru the wall and stopped on top of a stack of paper. Compl was hit in the right arm between elbow and wrist by either 2 or 3 fragments from the bullet, or wood, or pieces of glass. Compl states after he looked up and saw

compl realized what had happened, he ran upstairs and got his pistol, and called police. Compl states immediately after he heard the bullet hit, he heard a car leave the parking lot of the church, which is on the north side of the room he was in. Compl does not think medical attention was necessary for his arm. A witness by car, Kirk Coleman, w/m/14, 4338 Newton, Dallas, 75209, states he was sitting in the back room of his home, and heard what sounded like a shot. Compl immediately pulled himself up over the stockade fence in the rear of the church, and as he looked onto the church parking lot he saw some unk/w/m/ speed down the drive as it is Turtle Creek, in either 49 or 50 Ford, light green. He then noticed what appeared to be a car with the door open on a 58 Chev., blk with white stripe down side, states this person was next to the west pushed up and was leaning over as if he was putting something into the floorboards. The person got inside the Chev. and sped away from the lot. (There was a meeting of some sort at the church, and the lot was full of car, but at the time the witness looked out there were the only people on the lot). The bullet which was recovered appeared to be that of a powered rifle, and was a steel jacket bullet. This was given to Det. G. E. Brown, Crime Lab. A friend of compl's name Robt. Surrency, w/m, states he saw 2 men sitting in a dk. 63 Ford in alley behind compl's house for about 30 min. States after Compl went inside he saw these 2 men get into car and drove down Turtle Creek to Akard, then went left on Pacific where witness stopped following them. He states both were dressed in suits, and the car had no license plates on it. E.E. McElroy & Co. are the owners of the car. They will supplement.

A police officer contacted Kirk Coleman W/M/14 of 4338 Newton. He stated that he was in the back room and heard a noise. He thought it was a blowout. The boy who was with him, Ronald Andries W/M/19 also of 4338 Newton said it was a gun shot. Kirk stated that he then ran out back and climbed the back fence and saw a man getting into a 1949 or 1950 Ford, Lt. Green or Lt. blue and take off. This was on the parking lot of the Church next to General Walker's home. Also on further down the parking lot was another car, unknown make or model and a man was in it. He had the headlights on and Kirk could see him bend over the front seat as if he was putting something in the back floorboard. The only description Kirk could give on this car was the fact that it was black with a white stripe. The other boy, Ronald, did not climb the fence so he did not see this. The only description the boy could give of the person who got into the Ford was that he was middle size and had long black hair. There were several other cars on the parking lot because some function was in progress at the Church. The Church has lights for the parking lot but Kirk stated that the lights were not on. -- The person that was in the Ford took off in a hurry but the person in the other car did not seem to be in a hurry.

The boy made me promise him that this would not get out in the newspapers. His name was already in the newspaper and he is scared to death that the assassin will attempt to do away with him. He also stated that the part in the newspaper article about saying that several people were in the Ford was wrong. This officer had a duty to come out to assure the boy and his family that they would check the house for them. We observed a plain car with an uniform officer as he kept circling the parking lot and General Walker's home with his lights out. This made Kirk feel a little better. This offense remains pending.

Officers Van Cleave & McElroy arrived at 4011 Turtle Creek shortly after the incident was reported. The compl. stated that he was sitting at his desk in the house doing his income tax return when the incident occurred. Officers observed a bullet of unknown caliber, steel jacket, had been shot through the window, striking the frame of the window and going into the wall above comp's head. The bullet lodged in some paper in the next room. Comp. stated that when he heard the shot, he thought it was some sort of fireworks. Upon observing the evidence, he ran upstairs to his bedroom to get a pistol. He said that he has no idea who could have committed this offense. The spent bullet was given to Det. B.G. Brown of the CSSS at the scene. We searched the grounds at the rear of the house and also the alley, with negative results. We also interviewed Robert Surrey w/m/35, 506 Linde Wood LA 6-7741 who was at the scene upon our arrival. This subject is a business associate and aide to the complainant. Mr. Surrey stated that on Saturday, April 6th about 9:00 PM he drove up the alley behind the comp's house and noticed two w/m/-BOD sitting in a 1963 Ford dark purple or brown, parked near the complainant's house. Mr. Surrey also stated that he observed these men get out of the car and walk around the comp's house. The comp. did not seem to be disturbed about the incident. Mr. Surrey it was obvious that there were no license plates on the 1963 Ford. Patrol squad 26, Sgt. Hansen and 508 were also at the scene.

contacted the complainant on this date. Through interviews with the employees, who are all voluntary workers at this location. General Walker stays in the house at night alone. Investigation reveals that an unknown assailant in all likelihood fired the shot from the alley directly north of the rear part of the house. Investigating officers found a very small chipped edge of the top portion of the rear fence. This small chipped portion indicated that something had been laid on this yard very recently, as this was a fresh chip. In lining up the path of the bullet, it would indicate that the shot was fired from just below the chipped portion of the fence. The bullet struck the window frame near the center locking device. On the point where the bullet hit the window frame to the point where it struck the wall is a downward trajectory. The back yard is an up-grade to the alley. The fence in the rear of the house at the alley is a lattice type fence made out of wood approximately 1x6, with approximately 8" open spots. It is the investigating officers opinion that the shot was fired from just below the top edge of the fence. The Walker home is adjoined by a parking lot of a church to the east. The alley runs into the rear part of the parking lot. The alley then takes up in a northerly direction into Newman street. The witness, Kirk Coleman, lives at the north east corner of the Walker property just across the alley and directly across north from the church parking lot. This person has not been contacted by us as he is a school boy, but will be contacted at a later time as he could furnish valuable information from which he observed the incident. An interview with the volunteer workers revealed that they had not received no crank calls or letters preceeding the incident. An interview with Mr. Surrey reveals that two white men in a 1963 dark, dark purple or dark brown parked in the alley directly behind the complainant's car just off of Avonale street. These persons were witnessed getting out of the car and walking up to the property line and smoking the place over. Mr. Surrey became suspicious of these subjects and followed the car away from the location in an attempt to get a license number. Mr. Surrey states that there was no license plate on this car either front or rear, possibly this was a new car. A thorough search of the premises revealed no spent cartridges, no tracks or other evidence of value. The neighbors dog to the west of the Walker property is a fanatical dog but on this incidence did not make a sound. Gen. Walker recently accepted the position of Military Editor for a monthly magazine the American Mercury and has traveled extensively since. It is assumed the suspects had a minimum of knowledge concerning the complainant's activities. From where the complainant was and from where the shot was fired from the distance is approximately thirty to forty yards with a clear view as there are no window shades.

Investigating Officers interviewed Mrs Knecht, home address 5332 De Loache, EM 3 3389, on 4-10-63. Mrs Knecht stated that the SUBJECT Bill Duff first came to the General's house, he was driving a tan and brown Ford and had all his belongings in this car. For about a month people began to offer Duff jobs and he refused them and continued to stay at the General's house. Mrs Knecht gave Investigating Officers information that Duff had become engaged to Miss Whitley, employed at 4228 Oak Lawn Avenue. Mrs Knecht stated that Miss Whitley stated to her that their engagement had been broken when she found out that Duff had been borrowing money from her mother. Mrs Knecht further stated that Miss Whitley had contacted the British Embassy in Dallas and they had no knowledge of any such person on their records. Duff gave her his full name to Miss Whitley as William Mac Guin or Guine Mc Duff. Mrs Knecht stated that Dr. Ruth Jackson, who lives next door to The General has a dog that barks at everybody and everything. The night that this offense occurred Jackson's dog did not bark at Suspects. Investigating Officers received other information from Mrs Knecht that Dr. Jackson's dog was very sick yesterday and is also sick today. Reason for this illness is unknown at this time.

Investigating Officers will interview Dr. Jackson and Miss Whitley 4-13-63.

On the date Lieutenant Cunningham and Detective J. B. Toney contacted Robert Surrey, 3506 Lindenwood LA 6 7741, business address Johnson Printing Company, 2700 North Haskell, TA 3 6191. This person is in the printing business however does administrative work for General Walker. Surrey was re-interviewed regarding incidents he observed the evening before this offense occurred at which then he did not give any additional information with the exception of the below listed. Surrey stated that a large flood light in the rear area of the General's home was turned out on the night the offense occurred. Surrey stated that the suspects he observed lurking around the General's house were driving a 1963 Ford Four door sedan, either purple or brown, was hard to tell due to the lighting situation. Surrey gave Investigating Officers the name of a Subject, Bill Duff, white male approximately 32. Duff came to the General's home in early December 1962, and intended to be an immigrant from Scotland. Duff stated he was interested in the work the General was following and wanted to help him just for a place to stay. Duff stated that he had only been in the Dallas area at that time two weeks and without mentioning he had to study all the time to obtain his American citizenship papers. Duff became very lazy about the house after a while and would not work about the 10th day of March 1963, Duff's luggage was moved into the hall and Duff was asked to leave the house. Surrey stated further that in packing Duff's luggage he found a receipt for an airline ticket made out to William Duff dated sometime in the spring of 1962 showing passage from San Francisco, California, Seattle, Washington, indicating that Duff was not telling the truth about his arrival in this country. Surrey received information about Duff from other sources proved that Duff was not telling the truth about himself. Surrey advised Investigating Officers to contact the General's Secretary Mrs Knecht.

Walker called this officer on June 6, 1963 and stated that two private investigators had been checking on Bill Duff. He stated that sometime during the latter part of May an unknown lady called his Secretary and told her that she knew that Bill Duff had killed a Mr Charles Holloway, Apt. 123, 5420 Lewis, TA1-9091, That he Bill Duff, was the one who had shot at the General. I interviewed Mr. Holloway and he stated that Duff had never made such a statement. that Duff had moved into the Apt, with him several weeks prior to this time and that he had never talked of Gen. Walker. Holloway stated that there was a number of people who did not like Duff and that he owed several people money. One of these people was a Mrs Juanita Buchanan who runs the Eldorado Bar at No. Haskell. Mrs Buchanan stated she did not make the call to the Walker home. But she did think that Duff was capable of doing such a thing as shooting at someone. She stated that she had cashed several checks for Duff that were signed by Herman Garrard, 218 Lavesta. TA 7-3182. I interviewed Garrard and his Mother, Mrs Garrard. They stated that Duff had spent a night or so at their house and had borrowed money from her. Mrs Garrard denied making the phone call to the Generals home. At this time it is unknown who the lady is that made call to Compl. It is the opinion of this officer that Bill Duff did not have anything to do with the assault on General Walker.

Mr. Bill Keester, MU5-2745, Oklahoma City, Okla. and Mr. Cliff Roberts, MU5-1587, Oklahoma City, contacted this officer and stated that they were employed by General Watts of Okla. City, Looney, Watts and Looney Law Firm, as special investigators. Mr. Watts sent them to Dallas to investigate a Mr Bill Duff. Roberts came to Dallas in the later part of May and rented an Apt. in the same building that Duff was living in. He made contact with Duff and they became rather close and did quite a bit of drinking together. After making casual conversation with Duff about Gen. Walker and Duff did not seem to be interested in him, Roberts made the statement that someone should kill Walker. Duff stated that he would kill him if the price was right. Roberts told Duff that he knew a party who would pay to have the job done. At this time Roberts called Keester who came to Dallas and met Duff. Keester told Duff that he had the money to pay for killing Walker. Duff, Roberts and Keester planned how the job was to be done. Roberts made a tape recording of the plans. (This officer has the tape). Killing was set up for the night of June 10, 1963. On this date, June 6, 1963, Bill Duff called FBI Agent Hostie and told him of the arrangement with the two men to kill Gen. Walker. This officer interviewed Duff again and ran him on Lie Detector. It is the opinion of investigating officer that Duff never had any intention of shooting Walker, however I think he would have taken any money offered in advance. Duff stated that he was just trying to get any information that these people may have as to who tried to kill Gen. Walker.

Investigating officers interviewed a Mrs Whitley, 4228 Oak Lawn, La 1 2320. She stated that she had been engaged to William McDuff, w/m/33, 5-7, 165, described as having blue eyes, light colored hair, receding hair line. Mrs Whitley broke the engagement some three weeks ago. States that the last contact that she had had with McDuff was on April 6, 1963 about 2:30pm. Mrs Whitley stated that she was of the opinion that McDuff is an alien and that she had contacted the British Embassy in Houston, Tex. Who stated that they had no record in their office of this person being alien. She stated that she did not know what McDuff's occupation was. He told some friends of hers that he was in the auto sales business. She further stated that he had come by her place driving a 1957 model brown ford, 1962 model Oldsmobile, Ford Station Wagon, 1963 model Ford, 1963 model chevrolet, and a 1958 model maroon T-bird. She did not know the address at which McDuff was staying, but gave the telephone number of TA7 1869. This number is listed at 4805 Coles Manor, to a R.B. Ruwalt. Officers contacted the mgr of these apts and was informed that Mr. Ruwalt did not live there, but that his wife was living there. Wife owns a 1958 Maroon T-bird, and is reported to be a free lance model.

Contacted complainant who stated that McDuff came back by his office Saturday Aft. 4/13/63 about 2 pm and told him that he was in Phoenix, Ariz. when he had heard of the assault on complainant. Told Mr. Walker that he was driving for Denver, Chicago Truck Lines. This time McDuff was driving a Volkswagen, 1963 Tex. MU 8239. Mr. Walker gave the name of two other Dallas citizens who were reported to be friends of McDuff. One was Wilson, EM8 6669 and H.R. VanSchilling, EM3 4516. These people reported to be interested in money raising campaign for General Walker's cause. A man by the name of Mr. Arnold, of Wolf City called McDuff and made a dinner engagement on the eve of his departure for his speaking tour. This was the middle of last month.

For about a month people began to offer Duff jobs and he refused them and continued to stay at the General's house. Mrs Knecht gave Investigating Officers information that Duff had become engaged to Miss Whitley, employed at 4228 Oak Lawn Avenue. Mrs Knecht stated that Miss Whitley stated to her that their engagement had been broken when she found out that Duff had been borrowing money from her mother. Mrs Knecht further stated that Miss Whitley had contacted the British Embassy in Dallas and they had no knowledge of any such person on their records. Duff gave her his full name to Miss Whitley as William Mac Cain or Cuine Mc Duff. Mrs Knecht stated that Dr. Ruth Jackson, who lives next door to The General has a dog that barks at everybody and everything. The night that this offense occurred Dr. Jackson's dog did not bark at Suspects. Investigating Officers received further information from Mrs Knecht that Dr. Jackson's dog was very sick yesterday and is also sick today. Reason for this illness is unknown at this time.

Investigating Officers will interview Dr. Jackson and Miss Whitley 4-13-63.
