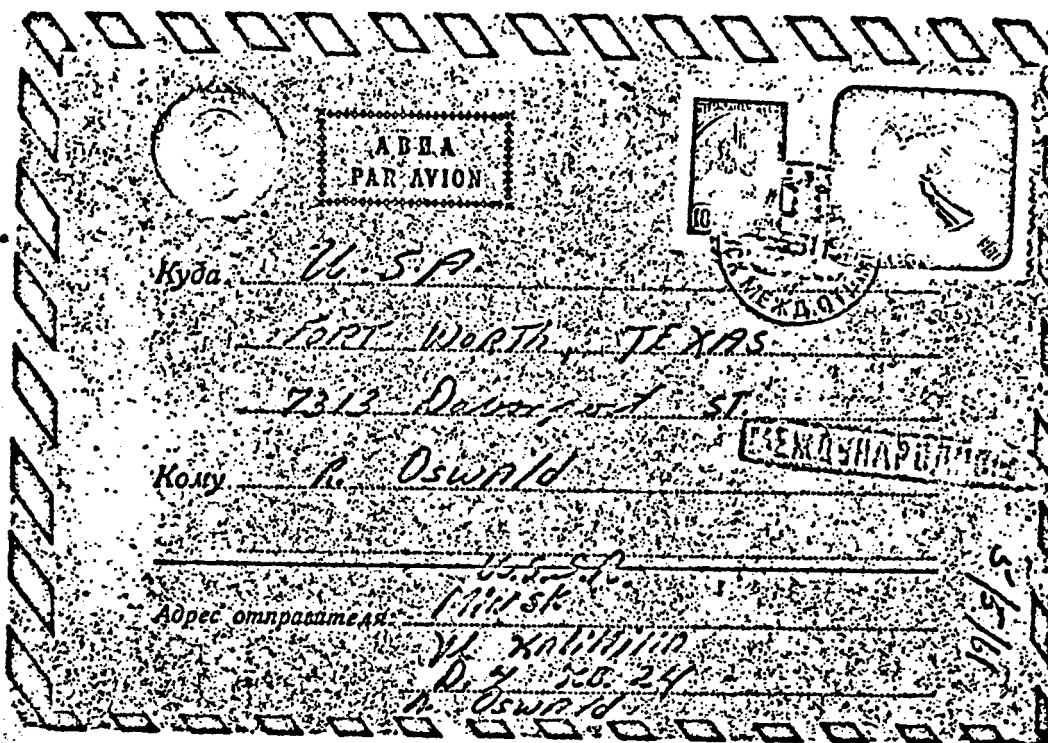

July 5 1944

We have a long time since

S.W. of Moscow. Munich is the capital  
city of the Soviet State of East Prussia.

I shall have been living here  
already a year and three months.  
I came to live in Munich just I  
wrote my last letter to you. I have  
been working at the local radio-  
television plant as a metal-writh.

On April 30 of this year, I  
got married. My wife is a Russian  
young girl, who was born in the city  
of Keningrad, which is the second  
largest city in the U.S.S.R. She parents  
are dead, and she was living with her  
aunt and uncle. She is a Jewish when
