Dallas, Texas March 19, 1964

I, Jane Berry, make the following voluntary statement to J. Hale McMenamin, who has identified himself to me as a Special Agent, Federal Bureau of Investigation.

I am a white female, bern on February 5, 1940 at Jacksonville, Florida. I surrently reside at 3718 Binkley, Dallas, Texas, and an employed by the Scott-Foresman Publishing Company, fourth floor, Texas School Book Depository Building, 411 Kim Street, Dallas, Texas.

On November 22, 1963 at approximately 12:35 P.M. I was standing on Elm Street in front of the Texas School Book Depository Building with Betty Thernton, also an employee at Scott-Foresman, to watch the motorcade bearing President John F. Kennedy pass by. As the motorcade passed by the building I heard three shots and observed the President slump over in the automobile in which he was riding.

I was not acquainted with Lee Harvey Oswald, although after viewing photographs of him in the newspapers and on television, Arecall having seen him around the Texas School Book Depository Building. At the time I heard the shots fired, I did not see Oswald, or know of his whereabouts.

During the morning of the assassination of President Kennedy, I saw no individuals in the Texas School Book Depository who attracted my attention in any way.

Following the assassination, all employees at Scott-Foresman were dismissed, and I left the building at approximately 3:00 P.M.
