Dear Marina,

Many thanks for your letter which I received a week ago. I was sorry to hear that Lee is out of a job. Is it difficult for yourself and him so far. I hope that he will find employment shortly and perhaps he already has.

It is too bad that you aren't in Dallas yet. I found out that it will be possible to enter Parkland Hospital; to get all the services and pay according to salary. Those who are unable to pay do not have to pay.

However, in order to receive this aid it is necessary to reside in Texas for one year and in Dallas county for six months.

Lee told me that he was learning a bit to drive the automobile while at or by an uncle. It would be very useful for him to learn how to drive. But it is difficult to find time for this when he works every day.

Tomorrow we, with children will leave for
Bethesda, Maryland where Myrland's brother and
his wife are residing. We will spend a day there
and then leave for Washington where we'll stay
with sister till Thursday. Then back to Paoli
where we expect my father. He will be with us
here for two days. I expect to be at Paoli
till September 10th, then proceed to Ohio and
Indiana where some relatives and friends are
residing and arrive in New Orleans during the
day or evening of the 20th.

I hope that you can understand this letter
since my errors are terrible. Please write
to me here in Paoli again. I'll be glad to
receive news and particularly glad to see
you, Lee and June in September.
