Reference is made to your letter of March 27, 1961 regarding your son, Lee Harvey Oswald, in the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics.

The Department perceives no resson why you may not communicate with your son.

His finencial status is not known to the Department. Economy, you will be informed should arrongements be made for his return to the United States, and he is in need of funds for transportation expenses.

Ton were informed in the Department's letter of Earch 22, 1961, that our Imbansy at Foscow had suggested to your son that he call at the Embansy for an interview. Your son recently informed our Embansy it was not convenient for him to come to Moscow for an interview. He stated that he bolieved he could not loave the city of Minnak without permission from the Soviet authorities. He was informed by the Embansy that it is the portion of the Soviet Government that it interposeene objection or obstacle to visits to the Embansy by American citizens in the Soviet Vaion. The Embansy suggested to your son that he use the Embansy's lotter in applying to the authorities in Hinsk for permission to travel to Hoseow.

You will be promptly informed as further reports are sectived from the American Embassy at Moscow.
