I refer to previous correspondence and conversations between you and officers of the Department concerning your son, Lee Marvey Oswald, in the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics.

In a communication received from the American Embassy at Moscow, it is reported Hr. Oswald states he has received assurance from the Soviet authorities that he may receive exit documentation. Your son states that he intends to delay his departure until his wife Peccives immigrant vies documentation, in order that they may leave together.

The Imberry believes it is desirable to have funds available for their transportation in order that they may leave as soon as possible after they both receive their documentation. It is national that tourist economy air passage to Now York will cost approximately \$150 per person. The Department will accept a remittance from you in the amount of \$900 for transmission to the Dabassy through official channels to enable that office to arrange transportation. Your Semittance should be in the form of a certified check, benk draft or money order made payable to the Department of State. When 10 is Peccived, the Imbassy will be notified.
