With reference to your night letter telegram received today, the American Embassy at Moscow reported in its ecommisation of January 16 your son had indicated in his latest letter he may be able to defray part of the cost. The Enhance is being requested to report how much Mr. Oswald can provide. In the meantime, it ... is hoped you will be able to raise the money possibly by a losn . from a bank or from relatives or friends. 

The International Rescue Committee, the address of which you requested on January 12, has informed the Department it wrote the Vernon Red Cross on Jamary 22 outlining the information it would meed to consider your request for financial assistance. It further reported it would not consider beloing hr. Oswald, only his wife, under its refuges program. Even assistance to her from this source is doubtful.

Concerning your suggestion that you make your son's story public with an appeal for help, although the Department is not in a position to advice you in this matter, it is not believed this would after Sincerely yours, a solution to his problem.
