we shall follow your
instructions in your
your letter of March 28th,




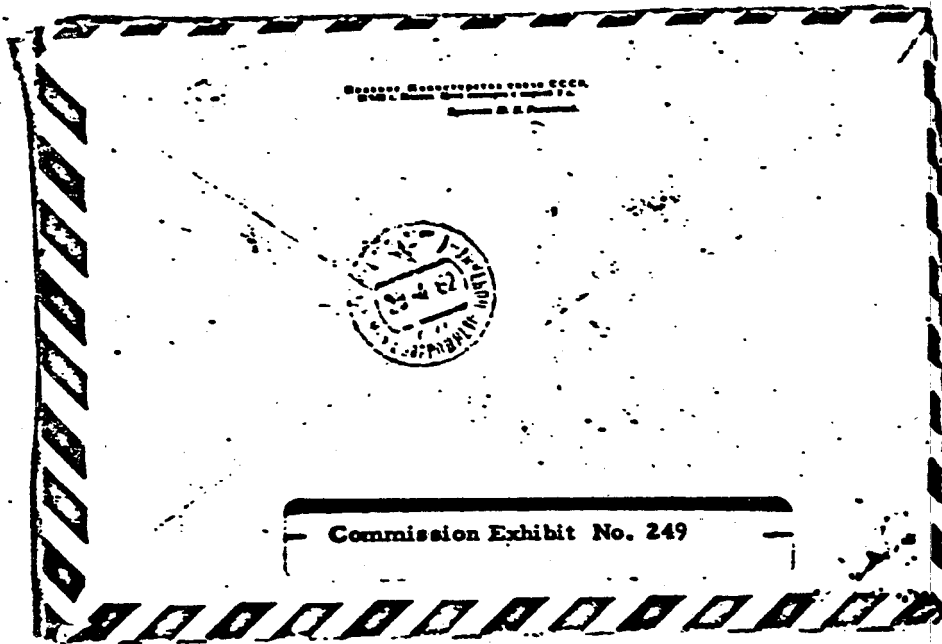
