keep writing. I think we get
all of each other's letters. My
love is still from you to me.

There is still no word
on our spirit visit.

We bought some children's
books for Cathy for Christmas,
and I'll be sending them along
in a few days, you should receive
them in a few weeks. The gift
is in Russian, but I'm sure she'll
enjoy the pictures.

It's already four months since
we put in our request for visit, it

gives you an idea how slow they can
be. What will we be going to have a
party in March, it's not going to be
so convenient to come back to the
States and try to start life over again.

I'll chat about \$200.00 to fly
from Moscow to New York for two people,
I don't have that much money, but I'm
hoping that the Embassy will help
^{me} but when we get out via's.

We have had our first snow
here on Nov. 16 now everything will
be white until about April 15.

Maria asks Wade to send
her a few fashion magazines every
now and then if possible.

Why don't you send me your
shoe size, and I'll see about sending
you some Russian boots, they are
black, high [like riding boots in
the States] maybe you can cut a
piece of cardboard or string to show

in your sign (since in business my
size would be 5:11)
Well that's about all for now.
Mama sends greeting to all the
family; you, Vada, Elly and Robert Jr.
