I am writing in response to a morning from a story published in the New York Times of Dec 21 on the status of Fra Lee H Oswald since the arrest and death of her husband. The Times story centered on the theme that perhaps has Oswald is being held incommunicatio.

The national office of the American Sivil Liberties Union in New York Sity has received a considerable number of inquiries about the status of Ers Oswald. In response to this, the Assumption contacted me as president of its Dallas affiliate, asking if I could detund to the exact nature of the situation.

I called the Secret Service office and talked with a Mr Fatterson, who assured me insidewald is free to come and go as she pleases. Asking then to see her, I was told to contact John Thorne, her attorney.

I called Er Thorne and outlined the a buta ce of the Times stor. He replied he was perfectly satisfied with kra Caweld's status.

Hoping to arrange an interview with Hrs Caweld, I called Hrs Rut. Fains, whom I understand is a good friend of Hrs Oswald's. Hrs Fains talks we she hasn't seen Frs ewald since How 25, has received a Christmas greating from her, but nothing directly in ruply to several letters to her.

So clear up the conficien concerning Krs Oswald's present status, may I rectent a brief meeting with her. I assure I shall discuss only her present status.

E would ask too the permission for Mrs Faine to accompany me as an interpreter. I suggest the interview be made as brief and as informal as possible. I want Mrs Oswald to speak as frankly as she can about her agreeing to the security measures that seem to surround her mow and about her present situation generally.

I hope I make it clear there are no personal doubte about the competence of kr Oswald's advisers. The request I make is in response to confusion about Krs Oswald's status.

The Dallae Civil Liberties Union board of directors will meet later this week. May I hear from you no later than Thursday!
