OSWALD LINKED TO MURDER GUN BY PHOTOGRAPH

Found in Houston Area Wife's Home

DALLAS (AP) — Dallas Police Chief J. Lee Carr said today a photograph found in the home of Lee Harvey Oswald's Houston-area wife had been taken with the rifle used in the assassination of President Kennedy.

Carr said the picture found in the home is "definitely Irving" Oswald's, "and it is evidence in Oswald's murder trial."

He has been charged with murdering the President, killing a Dallas policeman and with carrying a handgun in the State Car (1963 Oswald).

The last charge, which was added to Oswald's charges, was "Carrying a handgun in the State Car."

"We had the gun in good shape when we turned it in to the Dallas Police," Carr said.
