On October 20, 1188, a pustout interview by a scial agent of the FMI at 2515 West 5th Street, Irving, and, reflected that Mrs. RUTH PAINE resided at 2515 West the Street. Mrs. PAINE was depended from her husband, MICHARL RAIDE PAINE, and it was determined that Mrs. PAINE was employed at St. Marky School of Teras, Dallas, Texas, on a part-time basis as a teacher of the Russian language, and she had a Musican-born voman living with her. This Russian-born voman gave havel to a boby girl about a teck ago, and Mrs. PAINE was taking time of this woman. It was determined that the husband of the Russian-born woman visited his wife at this address periodically but did not reside there.

On Cotober 31, 1888, NES. DONOTHY SHITH, Irving, Texas, Gradit Bureau, advised that they had a credit record for NICHEL R. PAND and has vide, RUM PAINE, who resided at 2515 West 5th Street, Irving, Texas. Mrs. Shith advised their credit was satisfactory, and that Mr. Philli was employed by Bell Helicoptur Company in Fort Worth, Texas, as an engineer. Mrs. PANDL's employment was shown as a housewife.

On October 31, 1003, 19. EDMAND T. OVIATT, Assistant L. idmaster, St. Marks School of Towns, Dallas, Texas, advised that Mrs. PAIMS was a satisfactory employee and was loyal to this country. He considered her to be a stable individual. Mr. OVIATT advised that Mrs. PAIMS was employed on a part-time basis as a teacher of the Russian language. He also learned in a conversation with Mrs. PAIMS that she had a Russian-born woman living with her, and she was assisting this woman in view of the fact that she had recently had a new baby and she, Mrs. PAIMS, was improving her Russian speaking ability by having this Russian-speaking person in her house.

On Outcome 31, 1963, Mr. TED SCHURMAN, Security Officer, Bell Relicopter Company, Fort Worth, Texas, advised that Michael R. PAINE was presently employed by that company was an engineer, and he holds a scourity clearance.

On November 1, 1888, Mrs. RUNN PAINE was interviewed, at which time she advised that MARIMA OSWALD, wife of LEE EARVEY ORWALD, was staying with her following the recent birth of her baby. Mrs. PAINE furnished CSWALD's place of employment as the Texas School Book Depository (TSED), 411 Elm Street, Dallas, Texas, where he was employed as a laborer. Mrs. PAINE stated she did not know where OSWALD was residing in Dallas at this time, but it was his plan as soon as he had enough money to get an apartment for his family and then take his wife and children to live with him. Mrs. PAINE volunteered that she would be glad to furnish this address to the FBI as soon as she determined where the OSWALDS were residing.

On November 5, 1833, Mrs. RUTH PAINE advised that she had been unable to obtain the address of LEE OSMALD in Dallas, but she would furnish it to the FBI as soon as she was able to obtain it. Mrs. PAINE advised that LEE OSMALD had visited his wife, MARINA OSMALD, on November 2 and 3, 1963, at Irving, Temas. Mrs. PAINE then expressed the opinion that she considered LME OSMALD to be in illegical person and recalled that he admitted to her being a "Trotskyite Communist".

On Movember 22, 1963, Mrs. RUTH PAINE advised Special Agent JAMES W. BOOMEOUT upon interview at the Dallas Police Department that she first not LEE MARVEY OSWALD and his wife, MARINA OSWALD, during the early part of 1963 at a party. Inseruch as she was interested in the Russian language and was a teacher of the Russian language, she became friendly with MARINA OSWALD.
