This is to record that at 12:45 p.m. on 9/25/64 a long distance telephone call was received from Washington from Mr. ROBERT ADAMS, Deputy Assistant Secretary of State for Inter-American Affairs. Mr. ADAMS advised that he had before him a copy of "your summary memorandum of 180 pages in the OSWALD case." He was apparently referring to our letterhead memorandum of 5/18/64.

He said this memorandum had been received together with a cover letter from the Director advising that the Presidential Commission was desirous of publishing this memorandum. Prior to declassifying the memorandum the Bureau desired to know of the State Department its opinion on whether its publication would have any effect on Mexican-U.S. relations. ADAMS was calling to get the writer's reaction as to the effect on these relations. He was, of course, told that this was not a subject for comment by me.

ADAMS mentioned that it was the feeling in his office that the information contained in the memorandum was going to become public knowledge in a very short time in any event and for this reason they were inclined to approve declassification.
