gotiations with a Dallas morticlan yesterday and agreed to pay him \$3495 for services rendered on the day of Pres ident John F. Kennedy's as sassination.

The Oneal Funeral Home of Dallas, headed by Vernon B. Oneal, provided a bronze casket and a hearse to transport the President's body from Parkland Hospital to Love Field for the flight to Washington.

Subsequently, a GSA spokesman said, the agency neceived a bill for \$3995; which it considered somewhat out of line.

After GSA accountants requested an itemization, the funeral home knocked \$500 off the bill, but the amount was still questioned, the Government spokesman said.

In March of last year, the Oneal firm was asked to submit a third bill. A month later, Oneal came to Washington to talk with the GSA, but nothing was resolved.

It was all threshed out yesterday afternoon during a meeting in the office of Rep. Earle Cabell (D.Tex.) and attended by Oncelland Computer Section 1988. tended by Oneal and GSA officials.

Cabell, a former Dallas mayor who won election to ongress last November, had this to say afterward:
