## Oswald Gun Bill Is Passed

Senate passage sent to President Johnson yesterday a bill authorizing the Government to acquire and preserve the rifle used to kill President-Kennedy and other items of evidence in the assassination.

The Commission headed by Chief Justice Earl Warren that investigated the assassination recommended that a large number of items of physical evidence remain in the possession of the Government.

The bill would authorize the Attorney General to designate items required by the national interest to be acquired and preserved.

The Senate also sent to President Johnson by voice vote legislation to provide free airmail letter service for U.S. servicemen in overseas combat areas. The bill also would fix lower rates for air parcel post on packages, not exceeding five pounds, sent to or by serv io<del>cinen in</del> these areas.
