AUSTIN, TEX., NOV. 20 (UPI) -- JOHN CONNALLY'S HANDSOME FACE CLOUDED AND HIS EYES REDDENED IN RECOLLECTION: "I FELT A HARD IMPACT, AS IF SOMECNE HAD HIT ME IN THE BACK--A VERY HARD BLOW WITH A CLOSED FIST, IT FELT LIKE."

SO DOES THE GOVERNOR OF TEXAS REMEMBER THE THREE SHOTS BY LEE HARVEY OSWALD THAT TORE LIFE FROM JOHN F. KENNEDY AND GRAVELY WOUNDED CONNALLY AT APPROXIMATELY 12:30 P.M. CST (1:30 P.M. EST) ON A DALLAS STREET, FRIDAY, NOV. 22, 1963. IT IS A MEMORY BROUGHT BACK TO HIM CONSTANTLY BY PAIN, SUDDEN BURSTS OF SOUND AND THE

SIGHT OF HIS SCARS.

AT MEALS, HE WILL REACH FOR A BOWL WITH HIS RIGHT HAND AND SWITCH TO HIS LEFT WITH A TWINGE OF PAIN IN HIS WOUNDED RIGHT

BATHING AND SWIMMING, HE SEES THE MARKS ON HIS BODY.
ONLY WITH PELUCTANCE WOULD CONNALLY CONSENT TO TALK ABOUT IT
AS THE SECOND ANNIVERSARY OF THE ASSASSINATION APPROACHED. HE
SPOKE IN AN INTERVIEW BECAUSE HE FELT HE OWED IT TO HISTORY.
"I THINK ABOUT IT ALMOST CONSTANTLY, ALMOST EVERY DAY," HE
SAID WITH OBVIOUS MENTAL ANGUISH. "EVERY TIME I SIT DOWN
TO A MEAL I'M REMINDED OF IT. I CAN'T PROPERLY USE A FORK WITH MY RIGHT HAND.

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ACOMIO LIGHT

TAKE A SHOWER OR GO SWIMMING, I SEE THE SCARS...

A BULLET FROM OSWALD'S 6.5 MM MANNLICHER-CARCANO RIFLE PIERCET CONNALLY'S CHEST, COLLAPSING A LUNG, WENT THROUGH HIS LEFT THIGH AND BROKE HIS RIGHT WRIST.

CONNALLY STAYED IN THE HOSPITAL AT DALLAS FOR SIX WEEKS. HE WORE A CAST ON HIS WRIST FOR MONTHS. NOW 48. HIS HAIR IS MUCH GRAYER THAN IT WAS THAT DAY IN NOVEMBER, BUT HIS HEALTH CONNALLY'S MEMORIES UP TO THE TIME HE HEARD THE CRACK OF A THIRD SHOT FROM OSWALD'S RIFLES IN THE TEXAS SCHOOLBOOK DEPOSITORY ARE STILL VIVID: "THE CROWD WAS IMMENSE AND SPONTANEOUS." HE SAID. "I THOUGHT THE PRESIDENT WAS IN HIGH GOOD HUMOR. ABOUT THE TIME WE ARRIVED IN DALLAS THE SUN BROKE CLEAR AND IT LOOKED LIKE IT WOULD BE A IN DALLAS THE SUN BROKE CLEAR AND IT LOOKED LIKE IT WOULD BE A PERFECT DAY.

CONNALLY AND HIS WIFE NELLIE RODE IN THE JUMP SEATS OF A WHITE HOUSE LIMOUSINE, TOP DOWN, FROM LOVE (AIR) FIELD TO DOWNTOWN DALLAS. PRESIDENT AND MRS. KENNEDY WERE IN THE BACK SEAT, FACING "WE VERE LOCKING FORWARD TO A GREAT LUNCHEON THERE IN DALLAS AND TO A BIG DINNER IN AUSTIN THAT NIGHT." CONNALLY RECALLED.

"THEN THEN WE TURNED TO GO DOWN STEMMONS FREEWAY...."

"THE FIRST INKLING I HAD THAT ANYTHING WAS AMISS WAS WHEN I HEARD A SOUND THAT I THOUGHT WAS A SHOT. I TRIED TO TURN AROUND IN FRONT OF THE PRESIDENT. I FELT A HARD IMPACT...

"I SAID TO NELLIE, "MY GOD! THEY RE GOING TO KILL US BOTH!"

SHE KEPT SAYING, "BE STILL, BE STILL. YOU'RE GOING TO BE ALL RIGHT." RIGHT.

"I REMEMBER HEARING THE THIRD SHOT AND KNEW THAT SOMEONE HAD BEEN HIT A FATAL BLOW. THERE WAS BLOOD ALL OVER ME AND THE CONNALLY LOST CONSCIOUSNESS AT THAT MOMENT.
AT PARKLAND MEMORIAL HOSPITAL, WHILE ONE SURGICAL TEAM VAINLY WORKED ON PRESIDENT KENNEDY, ANOTHER TEAM OPERATED ON CON-SUDDEN NCISES STILL BOTHER CONNALLY. WHEN CHANCELLOR LUDWIG ERHARD OF WEST GERMANY VISITED PRESIDENT JOHNSON IN TEXAS DURING THE CHRISTMAS HOLIDAYS OF 1963. THE 21-GUN SALUTE FOR ERHARD UNNERVED BOTH THE GOVERNOR AND MRS. CONNALLY. CONNALLY STILL HUNTS OCCASIONALLY ON HIS RANCH NEAR FLORESVILLE, TEX. HE SAID THE SOUND OF GUNFIRE DOES NOT DISTURB HIM AND HIS CONNALLY STILL BONTS OF GUNFIRE DOES NOT DISCOUNTEX. HE SAID THEX. HE SAID THE SOUND OF GUNFIRE DOES NOT DISCOUNTERNOW.

"IT'S THE UNANTICIPATED NOISES THAT UNNERVE US," HE SAID.

"I DON'T PERSONALLY LIKE TO RELIVE IT AT ALL. IT SHOULD BE RELEGATED NOW TO THE PAGES OF HISTORY. I GRANTED THIS INTERVIEW BECAUSE I FELT I SHOULD, NOT BECAUSE I WANTED TO."

THE EVENTS OF NOV. 22, 1963, TAUGHT CONNALLY TWO THINGS. HE WAS REASSURED BY THE SMOOTH TRANSITION OF THE REINS OF GOVERNMENT FROM ONE-PRESIDENT TO ANOTHER, EVEN THOUGH "WE SUFFERED A GREAT SHOCK, A GREAT TRAGEDY."

IT TAUGHT CONNALLY A LASTING LESSON ABOUT THE DURABILITY:

OF THE U.S. GOVERNMENT.

MANNER THAT TIME IS FLEETING, "HE SAID. "YOU NEVER KNOW AT WHAT MOMENT YOU WILL BE CALLED."

HE WON A SECOND TWO-YEAR TERM OF OFFICE LAST YEAR IN A LANDSLIDE AND IS A SOLID FAVORITE FOR A THIRD TERM IN 1966.

HE FEELS MUCH CLOSER TO HIS WIFE AND THEIR CHILDREN--JOHN, 19; SHARON, 15, AND MARK, 12.

"I TRY TO SPEND MUCH MORE TIME WITH THEM THAN I HAVE IN THE PAST," CONNALLY SAID.

CONNALLY CORPESPONDED WITH MRS. KENNEDY FOR A WHILE.

BUT WE HAVE NOT HEARD FROM HER RECENTLY, "HE SAID. "OUR PATHS DO NOT CROSS.

HE HAS RETURNED TO DALLAS A NUMBER OF TIMES, BUT HE HAS NOT VISITED THE PLACE NEAR THE TRIPLE UNDERPASS WHERE HE AND THE PRESIDENT WERE SHOT.

"I HAVE PEEN BY IT, BUT I'VE NEVER STOPPED AND VISITED IT," HE SAID. "I DON'T ANTICIPATE THAT I WILL.

BUT I NEED NOTHING TO REMIND ME OF MY RELATIONS WITH HIM...AND I CONNALLY SAID THE RESENTMENT THAT SWELLED AGAINST DALLAS AS A CONNALLY SAID THE RESENTMENT THAT SWELLED AGAINST DALLAS AS A POLITICAL AND PERSONAL TIES IN DALLAS AND HE QUICKLY DEFENDS IT.

STRIKE OUT IN EVERY DIPECTION, HAS ALMOST, IF NOT ENTIRELY, FOR A WHILE, HE RECEIVED CRANK LETTERS BLAMING HIM FOR THE PRESIDENT'S DEATH, BUT EVENTUALLY THEY STOPPED COMING.

CONNALLY BELIEVES THE WARREN COMMISSION PROPERLY INVESTIGATED ALL ACTED INDEPENDENTLY.
