SUBJECT: The Congressional Record

Pages S2262-S2266. Senator Dodd, (D) Connecticut, advised that "according to press dispatches of the past few days, the office of District Attorney Jim Garrison in New Orleans has been conducting an independent investigation into the Kennedy assassination - - - Mr. Garrison is quoted as saying that other people beside Lee Harvey Oswald were involved; that his office already has the names of the people who participated in the initial planning in New Orleans; and that arrests will be made." Mr. Dodd included with his remarks a transcript of a record captioned "Oswald: Self-Portrait in Red," which is a debate between Lee Harvey Oswald and Edward Scannell Butler, which took place over a New Orleans radio station on August 21, 1963.
