### Shaw Planned Move to London

LONDON, March 17 (AP) — A British newspaper reported today that Clay Shaw, central figure in the New Orleans investigation into the assassination of President John F. Kennedy, planned to move to England next month. The Daily Mail said Shaw was well known in London Society and had once dined with the late Sir Winston Churchill.
