

## Puerto Rican Tells of a Role In Separate 'Plot' on Kennedy

tion "plot" investigation being pursued in New Orleans . . Cuban-trained agent sent to was overshadowed, at least. momentarily, by announcement by authorities in Manila yesterday that a 24-yearold Puerto Rican had confessed to joining with 15 other persons in a plot against the late President.
