(KENNEDY ASSASSINATION)

WASHINGTON--A MEMBER OF THE WARREN COMMISSION SAID TODAY THAT "HISTORY WOULD MAINTAIN THE POSITION" OF THE COMMISSION ON THE ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT JOHN F. KENNEDY.

SEN. JOHN SHERMAN COOPER, R-KY., SAID THAT "UPI HAS PERFORMED A VALUABLE PUBLIC SERVICE" WITH AN ANALYSIS OF MOVIE FILM WHICH DEMOLISHED A THEORY THAT A SECOND GUNMAN WAS INVOLVED IN THE ASSASSINATION.

THE UPI FILM WAS ANALYZED BY THE ITEK CORP., WHICH SAID THAT SHADOWS CAUSED WHAT APPEARED TO THE NAKED EYE TO BE A MAN ON THE ROOF OF A STATION WAGON SQUINTING DOWN A GUN BARREL TOWARD THE PLACE WHERE KENNEDY WAS SHOT.

THE LATE PRESIDENT'S BROTHERS, SEN. ROBERT F. KENNEDY, D-N.Y., AND SEN. EDWARD M. KENNEDY, D-MASS., DECLINED COMMENT ON THE ITEK-UPI STUDY. A SPOKESMAN SAID THEY DECLINED BECAUSE OF A FAMILY POLICY NOT TO SAY ANYTHING ON ANY DEVELOPMENTS SINCE THE WARREN COMMISSION REPORT.
