## FK Film Backs One-Gunman

LEXINGTON, Mass. — A leading photographic labora-. tory, after months of close examination of an amateur examination of an amateur movie film of President Kennedy's assassination, said yesterday that it has disproved the widely circulated theory of a second gunman.

The lick Corp. study had concentrated on 31 feet of 8mm. color film shot by Orville Nix, a Federal Government employe who was standing among spectators in Dealey Plaza in Dallas as the Kennedy parade passed

The film shows the President being hit by the fatal bullet and Mrs. Kennedy climbing onto the back of the convertible. In the background is the grassy knoll from where, according to some theories, a second rifleman pointed his gun. Enlargements of certain frames had seemed to bring out a man squinting down a gun barrel at Elm street, where Mr. Kennedy was shot.

ltck, a major manulac-turer of highly sophisticated reconnaissance cameras, said that by utilizing advanced image enhancement methods it determined that "the man with the rifle" proved to be nothing more than the shadow of tree branches and leaves on the side of a white pavilion on the knoll
