Shaw Trial Won't Try To Name Kennedy Killer

NEW ORLEANS (UPI)— Judge Edward A. Haggerty Jr. says New Orleans businessman Clay L. Shaw probably will be tried in August or September as a conspirator in the assassination of President John F. Kennedy.

Dist. Atty. Jim Garrison's office hinted yesterday that the prosecution would use mostly circumstantial evidence against Shaw.

Haggerty said the prosecution would not have to show how President Kennedy was killed in Dallas in 1963, but would only have to show that one overt act of conspiracy had been committed in New Orleans.

"The state does not have to tell the defense who killed Kennedy," the judge said.

Judge Frank Shae, holding court yesterday at the same time as Haggerty, set Aug. 9 as the trial date for Dean A. Andrews, Jefferson Parish (coun-

ty) attorney, on a perjury indictment in connection with the investigation.

Andrews' perjury indictment apparently arose from his refusal to identify Shaw as Clay Bertrand, a man Andrews says called him shortly after the assassination and asked him to represent Lee Harvey Oswald.
