COERCION IS DENIED. IN GARRISON INQUIRY

NEW ORLEANS, June 14 (UPI) - A police official said Wednesday that an investigation had cleared two of District Attorney Jim Garrison's investigators of coercion and bribery charges.

Presley Trosclair, acting Po-lice Superintendent, released a 37-page report concluding that the investigators, Lynn Losel and Louis Ivon, "have not vio-lated any rules of this department's code of conduct."


