Garrison Probe be McMaines signed a depo-sition denying she went to a New Orleans party attended by Clay Shaw and Lee Harvey Oswald two mostles before the assassination of Presidein John F. Kennedy.

Mrs. McMaines, 23, signed the deposition in a closed meeting with William Wegmann, an attorney for Shaw. Shaw has been charged with conspiracy in the death of Kennedy by New Orleans District Attorney Jim Garrison.

A chief witness against A chief witness against Shaw, Perry Russo, has testified that Mrs. McMaines, then known as Sandra Moffit, was at a party in September, 1963, which was attended by Shaw and Oswald, the assassin of the President.
