

Shaw Trial Will Begin On Schedule

NEW ORLEANS (UPI)—Dist. Atty. Jim Garrison today abruptly withdrew his motion for a delay in the trial of Clay L. Shaw, 55, on charges of conspiring to assassinate President John F. Kennedy and announced he will open the trial on schedule tomorrow.

Garrison's office made the surprise move at a hearing before District Judge Edward A. Haggerty, that was scheduled to hear arguments on the request.

"The case will go to trial tomorrow morning," Hagger said.

Garrison's office last week filed the motion for the delay on grounds it could not proceed until it had secured pictures and x-rays from the Kennedy autopsy, and the clothes the President was wearing when he was shot in Dailas on Nov. 22, 1963.

Legal actions and continuances already had delayed the trial of Shaw, a retired New Orleans business man for more a year.

Garrison's motion for a continuance followed the refusal of a judge in Washington to release immediately the autopsy evidence, after outgoing United States Attorney General Ramsey Clark made public the findings of a private panel of medical experts he had appointed a year ago. The panel, after studying the Kennedy autopsy material, concluded the Warren Commission was correct in saying the assassination shots in Dallas in 1963 came from behind.

Garrison, who has scoffed for two years at the commission's conclusion that Lee Harvey Oswald acted alone in the slaying, says his experts can show one shot came from the front.

The autopsy material, including clothing, photos and Xrays, was given to the National Archives by the Kennedy family with the proviso that it be kept secret, except to government investigators.
