NEW ORLEANS (UPI)--THE EIGHTH AND NEWEST JUROR CHOSEN TO TRY CLAY L. SHAW, CHARGED WITH CONSPIRING TO MURDER PRESIDENT JOHN F. KENNEDY, HAS EXPRESSED DOUBT ABOUT THE VALIDITY OF THE WARREN COMMISSION REPORT.

THE COMMISSION HELD THERE WAS NO CREDIBLE EVIDENCE LEE HARVEY OSWALD WAS A PART OF A CONSPIRACY IN THE ASSASSINATION. SHAW IS ACCUSED OF CONSPIRING WITH OSWALD AND DAVID W. FERRIE HERE IN SEPTEMBER, 1963, AND THE STATE WILL TRY TO PROVE HE MADE A TRIP TO THE WEST COAST IN NOVEMBER THAT YEAR IN FURTHERANCE OF THE PLOT.

THE STATE ALSO CLAIMS SHAW DELIVERED "A SUM OF MONEY" TO OSWALD AND JACK RUBY IN THE CAPITOL HOUSE HOTEL IN BATON ROUGE IN THE FALL OF 1963 AS PART OF THE PLOT. KENNEDY WAS KILLED NOV. 22, 1963, AND RUBY SHOT OSWALD TO DEATH TWO DAYS LATER.

THE JUROR, LLOYD E. HEINTZ, 40, A GEOPHYSICAL DRAFTSMAN FOR AN OIL COMPANY, WAS SWORN IN LATE FRIDAY. BOTH SIDES ACCEPTED HIM WHEN HE SAID HE HAD NO OPINION ABOUT THE GUILT OR INNOCENCE OF SHAW, 55, A RETIRED NEW ORLEANS BUSINESSMAN.

HEINTZ HAD BEEN ASKED BY ASSISTANT DIST. ATTY. JAMES L. ALCOCK DURING HIS EXAMINATION AS A JURY PROSPECT IF HE HAD "ANY OPINION OF THE MERIT OR LACK OF MERIT OF THE WARREN REPORT."

"I HAVE SOME DOUBT," HEINTZ REPLIED.

ASKED WHAT LED HIM TO QUESTION THE REPORT'S VALIDITY, HE REPLIED: "I CAN'T SAY EXACTLY WHAT CAUSES THE DOUBT." I DID READ IN THE NEWSPAPERS ABOUT MARK LANE'S BOOK. THAT BOOK, "RUSH TO JUDGMENT," IS ONE OF THOSE CRITICAL OF THE COMMISSION REPORT OF SEPTEMBER, 1964.

HEINTZ ADDED THAT "I HEARD TESTIMONY OF THE GENTLEMAN WHO WAS DISQUALIFIED EARLIER BECAUSE HE HAD MISGIVINGS ABOUT THE WARREN REPORT-- OTHER THAN THAT (HIS OWN DOUBT) I HAVE NOTHING."

CRIMINAL DISTRICT JUDGE EDWARD A. HAGGERTY JR. EARLIER HAD DISMISSED A PROSPECTIVE JUROR WHO SAID HE HAD "GRAVE DOUBTS ABOUT THE GOVERNMENT'S POSITION THAT THERE WAS NO CONSPIRACY" AND THAT IT WOULD TAKE COURTROOM EVIDENCE TO REMOVE HIS IMPRESSION.

THE JUDGE EXHAUSTED HIS PANEL OF 169 PROSPECTIVE JURORS FRIDAY AND DREW 44 NEW NAMES FOR TODAY'S COURT SESSION FROM THE LIST OF ANOTHER SECTION. THERE ARE EIGHT SECTIONS TO THE DISTRICT AND THE CUSTOM IS TO BORROW FROM EACH OTHER WHEN NECESSARY.

HE SAID HE HAD SEEN FERRIE THERE TWO OR PERHAPS THREE TIMES BUT NEVER MET HIM.

MORGAN ALSO SAID THAT AS A BOY HE BELIEVED HE HAD WATCHED PERRY RAYMOND RUSSO PLAY HANDBALL IN A PARK OF HIS NEIGHBORHOOD. RUSSO IS A PRIME STATE WITNESS. HE HAS TESTIFIED HE OVERHEARD THE THREE ALLEGED CONSPIRATORS DISCUSS ASSASSINATION PLANS IN FERRIE'S APARTMENT HERE.

... THE CHIEF PROSECUTOR IN THE CLAY L. SHAW CONSPIRACY TRIAL DROPPED A STRONG HINT IN COURT TODAY THAT SOMEONE OTHER THAN LEE HARVEY OSWALD MURDERED PRESIDENT JOHN F. KENNEDY.

A SATURDAY MORNING COURT SESSION FAILED TO ADD ANY JURORS TO THE EIGHT SEATED IN THE FIRST FOUR DAYS OF THE TRIAL, WHICH STARTED TUESDAY. THIRTY-SIX MEN WERE REJECTED FOR JURY DUTY SATURDAY.

PATRICK HUGH POGESE, 37, AN ELECTRICAL ENGINEER, WAS UNDER EXAMINATION FOR THE JURY SATURDAY LONGER THAN ANY OF THE 36 ASST. 1ST. ATTY. JAMES ALCOCK ASKED HIS FEELINGS ABOUT WHAT HAPPENED IN DALLAS.

POGESE NODDED AND ALCOCK WENT ON: "SUPPOSE MY COLLEAGUES AND I WERE (INDICATING TWO OTHER ASSISTANT DIRECTOR ATTORNEYS) CONSIDERED TO KILL SOMEONE. WE WOULD BUY A RIFLE AND AT THAT POINT THE CONSPIRACY WOULD BE COMPLETE."

"BUT SUPPOSE THERE WAS ANOTHER CONSPIRACY TO KILL THE SAME MAN AND THEY GOT TO HIM BEFORE WE DID. THIS DOES NOT BELIEVE THE FIRST CONSPIRACY OF BLAME."

SHAW, AT 55 A FADING BACHELOR ABOUT TOWN, IS CHARGED WITH PLOTTING WITH OSWALD AND DAVID V. FERRE, A FORMER AIRLINE PILOT, BETWEEN SEPT. 4 AND OCT. 10, 1963, TO KILL KENNEDY IN DALLAS.

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
