INSERT 240A SHAW, NEW ORLEANS AFTER 3RD PGH XX ATTORNEY GENERAL.
 FINCK SAID IT WAS IMPOSSIBLE TO TELL PRECISELY FROM WHICH ANGLE
 THE BULLET THAT HIT THE PRESIDENT'S HEAD WAS FIRED. HE ALSO SAID THE
 EXIT OF THE WOUND IS NOT ALWAYS LARGER THAN THE ENTRANCE.

"THE WOUND OF (THE) EXIT MAY BE SMALLER THAN THE WOUND OF ENTRY,"
 HE SAID. "OR IT MAY BE LARGER THAN THE WOUND OF ENTRY. THE EXIT IS
 OFTEN LARGER THAN THE ENTRY BUT THAT IS NOT ALWAYS THE CASE."

UNDER CROSS EXAMINATION, FINCK WAS ASKED, "WHY DIDN'T YOU TRY
 TO ASCERTAIN THE TRACK OF THE BULLET THROUGH THE BODY?"

"AS I RECALL I WAS TOLD NOT TO DO THAT, BUT I DON'T REMEMBER
 WHO TOLD ME," FINCK SAID.

CHIEF DEFENSE ATTORNEY F. IRVIN DYMOND PROTESTED THAT THE
 PROSECUTION WAS TAKING THINGS OUT OF CONTEXT FROM THE WARREN REPORT
 AND USING THEM TO QUESTION FINCK.

DYMOND READ A PASSAGE FROM THE REPORT AND IT TURNED OUT THAT WHAT
 FINCK TOLD THE WARREN COMMISSION WAS THAT THE BULLET WHICH HIT
 THE PRESIDENT'S HEAD SHATTERED INTO MANY FRAGMENTS.

THE JURY WAS BROUGHT BACK IN AND HAGGERTY ASKED HOW MUCH LONGER
 THE CROSS EXAMINATION OF FINCK WOULD TAKE. THE PROSECUTION SAID IT
 DID NOT KNOW AND HAGGERTY RECESSED THE COURT UNTIL TUESDAY MORNING.
