Gurvich after Gurvich re-signed as an investigator for the District Attorney's office. He accused Gurvich of stealing valuable papers when he left the job.

Garrison on Monday charged Shaw with two counts of perjury. The charges said Shaw lied when he testified at his trial that he did not know Oswald or Ferrie.

Shaw's perjury trial was assigned today to Criminal District Judge Malcolm O'Hara; who was Garrison's opponent in the 1965 District Attorney's race. O'Hara was one of three judges who conducted a preliminary hearing in 1967 for Shaw and ordered him held for trial.
