JOHN F. KENNEDY.

WHILE REFUSING TO DISCUSS ANY INFORMATION THAT MIGHT HAVE BEEN
GATHERED BY THE COMMISSION INVESTIGATING THE CIA, HEADED BY VICE
FRESIDENT NELSON ROCKEFELLER, FORD NOTED THAT HE HAD SERVED ON THE
WARREN COMMISSION WHICH INVESTIGATED THE KENNEDY ASSASSINATION AND IT
HAD FOUND NO CONNECTIONS OR PLOTS.

"IT'S MY UNDERSTANDING THAT THEY (THE ROCKEFELLER COMMISSION) ARE
TAKING A VERY EROAD LOOK, FORD SAID. "UNTIL I GET THEIR REPORT, I
THINK IT YOUULD BE FREINTURE FOR USE TO MAKE ANY COMMENT AS TO
FRECISELY THERE THEY ARE GOING WITH THEIR INVESTIGATION.

"NOW, AS A FORMER MEMBER OF THE WARREN COMMISSION -- A COMMISSION
THAT I THINK DID A GOOD JOB -- WE FOUND AS A WARREN COMMISSION NO
CONNECTION OF ANYTHING BETWEEN CUBA AND THE UNITED STATES. JE FOUND
NO EVIDENCE OF A CONSPIRACY, FOREIGN OR DOWESTIC."

THERE HAVE BEEN REPORTS THAT THE COMMISSION IS INQUIRING AS TO
WHETHER KENNEDY MIGHT HAVE BEEN KILLED IN REFRISAL FOR SOME
CIA-SPONSORED PLOT TO ASSASSINATE CASTRO.
