Dallas FBI Asked To Reopen Probe

DALLAS (UPI) — J. Gordon Shanklin, special agent in charge of the Dallas office of the FBI, said Thursday the Rockefeller Commission has asked the FBI to help question local police officers in connection with the assassination of President John F. Kennedy.

Shanklin said the commission's request did not originate with his office but involved an FBI photographic expert from Washington and a local agent. The expert arrived in town several weeks ago and questioned officers who were in Dealey Plaza the day Kennedy was killed.

"The Rockefeller Commission asked us to assist in this," he said. "If they reopen the investigation, I don't

know who they'll have to do it.

Nothing Planned

"As far as our office is concerned, there's nothing further planned now, but that could change overnight."

Shanklin, who retires next month, says the officers were shown a photograph of three "tramps" arrested on a nearby railroad track that day. Some observers have held the men in the photograph resembled several of the participants in the Watergate conspiracy.

The Dallas Times Herald said FBI agents in Los Angeles questioned a former strip tease performer in the course of renewed inquiries into the Kennedy killing.

It quoted Shari Angel, a former stripper in a night club owned by Jack Ruby, as saying she was interviewed by the FBI Monday in Los Angeles concerning her conversations with Ruby just before he died in 1967.

Ruby was the killer of accused Kennedy assassin Lee Harvey Oswald. He died in a Dallas hospital while awaiting retrial for the murder of Oswald, committed two days after the Nov. 22, 1963, slaying of Kennedy in a Dallas motorcade.

Lives in Dallas

The Times Herald said the former stripper, now a 42-year-old grandmother living in suburban Dallas, reported she was queried about her associations with Ruby and about reports Oswald had visited Ruby's nightclub shortly before the assassination.
