FBI Chiefs Accused-in Letter Case

Top FBI officials ordered a threatening letter written by Lee Harvey Oswald destroyed shortly after the 1963 assassination of President John F. Kennedy, The New York Times reported yesterday.

The Times said then FBI chief J. Edgar Hoover "probably" wis in on the decision, because the person who relayed the order to destroy the letter was one of his assistance. tants who would not have acted except on Hoover's instructions.

The decision to destroy the letter was made at a meeing of top agency officials in Washington the weekend after Kennedy's death, the Times said, quoting "a source familiar with the meeting." It did not say who attended the highlevel meeting or whether Hoover was there.

The existence of the letter was first reported earlier this month by the Dallas Times-Herald.

FBI dilector Clarence M. Kelley, in a statement, confirmedits existence and said there was evidence it had been destroyed. He said the letter, delivered to the FBI's Dallas bureau about 10 days before the President was killed, apparently warned in-vestigators not to make further attempts to interview Oswald's Russian-born wife. It did not threaten the President.

The Times, however, quoted its source as saying the letter contained a threat to "blow up" the Dallas police department.

The letter was destroyed to avoid potential embarrass-ment to the FP and not to hinder the investigation of Kennedy's death, the Times source said.

He said an assistant to Hoover, who relayed the order to the Dallas FBI Sureau, would never have directed the destruction of possible evidence except on Hoover's expressed order.
