WASHINGTON (UPI) -- AN FBI AGENT SAID HE DESTROYED A NOTE FROM PRESIDENT KENNEDY'S ASSASSIN, LEE HARVEY OSWALD, ON ORDERS FROM A SUPERIOR TWO HOURS AFTER OSWALD HIMSELF WAS MURDERED, A TOP FBI OFFICIAL TESTIFIED TODAY.

BUT THE OFFICIAL SAID THE NOTE APPARENTLY HAD NOTHING TO DO WITH THE KENNEDY ASSASSINATION ON NOV. 22, 1963.

JAMES ADAMS, DEPUTY ASSOCIATE FBI DIRECTOR, ALSO TOLD A HOUSE JUDICIARY SUBCOMMITTEE IN PREPARED TESTIMONY THAT ANOTHER OFFICER IN THE DALLAS FBI OFFICE SAID HE HAD NO KNOWLEDGE OF WHAT HAPPENED TO THE NOTE.

"THE SUPERVISOR HAS TOLD US THAT HE HAD NO KNOWLEDGE OF THE DISPOSITION OF THE NOTE," ADAMS SAID.

BUT ADAMS SAID THE AGENT WHO RECEIVED THE NOTE "STATED THAT APPROXIMATELY TWO HOURS AFTER OSWALD HAD BEEN PRONOUNCED DEAD ON NOV. 24, HIS SUPERVISOR TOLD HIM THAT THE SPECIAL AGENT IN CHARGE WANTED TO SEE THEM."

HE CLAIMED THAT, UPON ARRIVING AT THE SPECIAL AGENT IN CHARGE'S OFFICE, HE WAS INSTRUCTED BY THE SPECIAL AGENT ~~TO DESTROY~~ DESTROY BOTH THE NOTE AND THE MEMORANDUM REGARDING IT THAT HE HAD GIVEN THE SPECIAL AGENT IN CHARGE ON THE NIGHT OF NOV. 22. **DEC 16 1975**
