WILLIS informed that after he had finished taking his pictures he proceeded to Eastman Kodak Company to have his film developed. He stated while at Eastman Kodak Company, FORREST V. SORRELS of the Secret Service came to the Eastman Kodak Company and inquired regarding any pictures taken during the time the Presidential motorcade was passing in the vicinity of the Texas School Book Depository building. He said after his film was developed he turned it over to Mr. SORRELS, who kept it for about a month and then returned it to him.

WILLIS advised he incorporated under the name of PHIL WILLIS ENTERPRISES, Post Office Box 17266, Dallas, Texas 75217, and has made arrangements to market the enclosed 12 series of slides.

WILLIS furnished the enclosed slides which are copies of his original film and informed they were copied by Fox - Stanley Photo Products, Incorporated, 1734 Broadway, San Antonio 6, Texas. He stated these slides need not be returned to him nor the printed sheet which is also enclosed. WILLIS stated the printed sheet will also be packaged with the slides when marketed.

It is suggested the Bureau may desire to view the enclosed slides and, if they depict anything of significance, should make appropriate copies for dissemination, both to the President's Commission and to the Dallas Office.

The complete interview of WILLIS will be contained in the next Dallas report submitted in captioned matter.
