I, ROBERT P. BUTLER, being duly sworn, hereby make the following free and voluntary statement to Assistant Director HAROLD N. BASSETT and Special Agent in Charge of the Tampa Office FRANCIS M. MULLEN, JR.

MR. BASSETT advised me of information coming to the Bureau's attention indicating the possibility that LEE HARVEY OSWALD had personally appeared at the Dallas Office sometime prior to the assassination of former President KENNEDY and at this time he left a note.

Concerning the above, I had absolutely no information concerning this matter until I read it in the newspaper. I have no knowledge whatsoever of a visit to the Dallas FBI Office by LEE HARVEY OSWALD or of any note left by him for any FBI Agent. I have heard no rumors to substantiate a visit by LEE HARVEY OSWALD or a note since I have been assigned to the Dallas Division. I learned of the alleged note and the alleged visit from a headline in the Dallas Times Herald in its issue of August 31, 1975.

Sometime subsequent to the assassination, I assisted  
in an interview with MARINA OSWALD with SA WALLACE R. HEITMAN.  
At no time during this interview did she mention a visit of  
her husband to the Dallas Office of the FBI.
