I, Donald E. Moore, having been duly sworn, make the following free and voluntary statement to Assistant Director Harold N. Bassett and Inspector J. Allison Conley, whom I know to be employees of the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

I have been advised of an allegation that Lee Harvey Oswald visited to Dallas Office prior to the assassination of President John F. Kennedy, that he left a note which was threatening in nature, and that the note was subsequently destroyed.

I had absolutely no knowledge of the above allegation concerning Oswald until approximately sometime in the first part of September, when I learned of it either through reading it in the newspapers or hearing of it on television.

I was Inspector in Charge of the Espionage-Research Branch of the Domestic Intelligence Division prior to the assassination and subsequent thereto. In fact, the investigation of Oswald, both prior to and subsequent to the assassination, was handled in this Branch of which I was the Inspector in Charge. I would like to repeat that I had no knowledge of this allegation until approximately the first part of September, 1975.
