I, Charles D. Brennan, having been sworn, make the following free and voluntary statement to Assistant Director Harold N. Bassett and Inspector J. Allison Conley whom I know to be employees of the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

I have been advised of an allegation that Lee Harvey Oswald visited the Dallas Office prior to the assassination of President Kennedy and that he left a note for SA Hosty. I have been asked to provide any and all information which I may have concerning this incident.

I had never heard of this allegation until the first week in September, 1975 when I heard mention of this information on a local television news broadcast. Prior to this time I had no knowledge, either directly or indirectly or did I ever hear any rumors concerning Oswald visiting the Dallas Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation or his leaving any note there.

I have read this affidavit consisting of this and one other page and it is true and correct to the best of my knowledge.
