UNITED STATES GEV emorandum Mr. Belmo November 24, 1963 FROM ASSASSINATION OF THE SUBJECT: PRESIDENT At 1:44 p.m., today, SAC Joseph Purvis, Norfolk, telephonically advised Supervisor J. W. Burns that immediately prior to his call, the Police Department at Newport News, Virginia, had received an anonymous telephone call from a male described as obviously Negro who stated roughly, "We got the President; now we are going to get Senator Byrd." SAC Purvis was instructed to confirm all pertinent information concerning this call by teletype. ACTION: At 1:48 p.m., Mr. D. Hanning, Duty Agent, Crime Records 🦠 Division, was telephonically advised concerning this information. Mr. Hanning stated that the Crime Records Division would handle the transmittal of this information to Senator Byrd or his staff at the earliest possible time. To whom call was TRACKY 1 - Mr. DeLoach SAC Purvis telephonically advised that the Newport News, Virginia; Police Department stated Walter Robinson was intoxicated at the time of his arrest, and stated that he did not know why he made the call except that Byrd "never did any thing for me." He did not represent himself as Minor Miller, however, he was located at Miller's address, and the police are confident that neither Miller nor anyone else at this address conspired with Robinson to make this call.
