The captioned individual at 6:45 p.m. on instant date called and advised Duty Supervisor Carl W. Spillers that she had witnessed the shooting of Lee-Oswald on television and that she had observed reruns of this film on television. She stated that from the expression on Oswald's face when he first saw his attacker indicated to -her that he knew the attacker. She said she observed this picture several times and she was convinced that Oswald was acquainted with the man who murdered him.

Mrs. Harrington stated that she was concerned over the safety of the various heads of state and high officials who are to meet in Washington tomorrow for Mr. Kennedy's funeral. She stated that it would be horrible if someone should drop a bomb among these people or use some other means to injure them. She stated that she had no information whatsoever that such a thing would be done but that she was thinking about the possibility and ramifications of such a tragedy.
