Captioned individual called at 4:30 p. m. this date and requested to speak with the Director. He spoke with Duty Supervisor Carl W. Spillers of the Special Investigative Division. Mr. Alig prefaced his statement with the comment that the FBI is the only Government agency in which the people could place confidence. He stated he felt there was definitely a communist conspiracy in connection with the assassination of President Kennedy and if Oswald's family does not repute Oswald, then they are also communists. Mr. Alig stated he had no information, just his opinion, and he wanted to express his concern over the fact that the Dallas Police Department was permitted to take custody of Oswald. Since the President of the United States was slain, he felt the FBI should have had custody. He stated that he felt that Rubenstein, who murdered Oswald, should be given a sodium drug to bring out the truth.

Alig stated he hoped that Mr. Hoover would talk with the new President and request appropriate laws be enacted to handle situation like the one encountered this week.

Bureau files indicate Eldon Alig, same address, on November 12, 1960, sent Director a telegram demanding investigation of fraudulent voting in national elections. When interviewed, Alig stated his information came from news media and he had no specific information. (Bureau file 56-2696)
