ASSASSINATION OF
PRESIDENT JOHN F. KENNEDY

On November 22, 1963, Ralph V. Wallington, age 70, 308 Kahlagen Apartments, Roseburg, Oregon, advised the Federal Bureau of Investigation, Portland, that he was in Jackson, Wyoming, on September 25, 1963, where he met and shook hands with President Kennedy. Wallington said later while talking to an employee of Chamber of Commerce, this person, whose name he did not know, spoke in a derogatory manner concerning the president. Wallington said that he reported this incident and this man to a clerk by the name of Clark in the Jackson, Wyoming, Post Office. Wallington thought this man might possibly have something to do with the assassination of the president.

Special Agent Robert H. Schmer, United States Secret Service, Portland, Oregon, was immediately advised of the above information on November 22, 1963.
