ASSASSINATION (F PRESIDENT KENNEDY November 22, 1963, Dallas, Texas

On November 26, 1963, E. J. McDaniel, Director, leterans Administration Domiciliary, Thomasville, Georgia, lephonically advised that Raleigh Odell McEwen, member of the domiciliary, had made some strong remarks about the formaty Teneral after the news of the death of the President November 22, 1963.

E. A. Mclaniel, when interviewed at the Veterans Finile's tration Domiciliary, advised Glen Alred, Jr., the Ansis ant Lordolliary Officer, would furnish the facts of the

lien Alred, Or., Assistant Domiciliary Officer, Elaberd to Raleigh McEwen concerning his making the remarks about the Attorney General. Alred stated McEwen told him he would discuss this matter with him on Monday, torenser 25, 1963.

Alred stated Martin Cozewith, a Section Leader, on November 23, 1963, furnished him with three statements. The first statement reflected McEwen stated on Friday after the resident's death, that it was a shame the President's brother was not in Pallas at that time so that he may have gotten it to. This statement was signed by Cozewith.

The second statement, signed by Vernon R. Anglin, reflected he everheard McEwen make derogatory remarks concerning the death of Iresident Kennedy. Anglin went on to say McEwen's remarks were of a highly natred and gratifying nature and

his concern. Of getting the President's brother was his main concern. He stated McEwen made further derogatory remarks relative to the Catholic Church and its policies. The third statement, signed by J. P. Sutton, reflected Sutton had remarked in a conversational way to McEwen that it was a terrible thing that occurred that afternoon. (McEwen's) reply "I don't know about that, Sutton. It all depends on how you look at it. Look at all the men he has killed," or words to that effect. Sutton then said to McEwen that he did not kill them and McEwen replied, "No, but his orders did." Sutton stated he then left the office to avoid any further discussion with McEwen.

Cozewith and Anglin were interviewed and stated the statements they made were correct but could add no additional information.
