SUBJECT: ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT

At 10:50 a. m., Mr. William Pendergrast (phonetic), National Republican Committee, Cafritz Building, called and spoke to Kemper in my office. Mr. Pendergrast said that he has some contacts among the Cuban refugees and that last evening one of them told him that he knew of an individual in New Orleans with the Fair Play for Cuba Committee who had had some contacts with subject Oswald. He said that he did not desire to discuss the matter on the phone and that he would be available for interview.

Accordingly, Kemper advised Special Agent Tucker in the Washington Field Office who is handling this matter to have someone contact Pendergrast as soon as possible and secure any information which he might have of value.
