



The United States Customs Service extends to you a most hearty welcome on your arrival in the United States and invites your attention to certain formalities attending to your clearance through Customs. These formalities include examination of your baggage by Customs. To assist and speed up the examination process, a baggage declaration is required for each passenger or the family group.

FAMILY DECLARATIONS: Members of a family residing in one household and traveling together may file a single declaration.

WARNING: Many items of fruit or other plant material, meat and meat products are prohibited from entry into the United States. All such items must be brought to the attention of the Customs Inspector, otherwise, you may be subject to penalties imposed by law.

FALSE STATEMENTS ON THIS FORM ARE PUNISHABLE BY LAW

FOR RETURNING RESIDENTS OF THE UNITED STATES ONLY (NONRESIDENTS - SEE PART B ON REVERSE SIDE)

EXEMPTIONS: As a returning resident of the United States you are allowed a \$100 duty free exemption once each 31 days provided you have been abroad at least 48 hours. This exemption applies to articles for your personal and household use. It does not include articles for sale, carried for other persons, or gifts for business purposes. Not more than 1 gallon of alcoholic beverages or 100 cigars can be included in your exemption.

FAMILY DECLARATIONS: If this is a family declaration, the combined exemptions may be applied against: (1) the total value of all articles acquired by all members of your family; and (2) the quantity limitations on alcoholic beverages and cigars.
