At 12:52 a. m. Midnight Supervisor William E. Assmus received a telephone call from Mrs. Nelda A. Fitzhugh, 2631 Antelope Street, Vernon, Texas, in which Mrs. Fitzhugh stated that she greatly feared her husband Howard Donald Fitzhugh may have been involved in the assassination of President Kennedy.

Mrs. Fitzhugh was crying and in a highly emotional state. She stated her husband hates his job, hates his employer and hates almost everything American and seems to be more than just a neurotic. Mrs. Fitzhugh stated that just the evening of 11/25/63 he had tried to convert her to the Communist Party. Mrs. Fitzhugh said her husband is an employee of the Amerada Petroleum Company, Tulsa, Oklahoma, and has been for ten years.

Mrs. Fitzhugh in her emotional condition could furnish no specific reason as to why she thought her husband might be involved in the assassination but she said she thought he ought to be checked out.

Bureau indices contain no information identifiable with the complainant or her husband, Howard Donald Fitzhugh.
